The Sidewalk to Catwalk Collection			
1	Chaleco	A Chaleco is an open fronted vest, it is a sleeveless garment without buttons or zippers and is worn, open. It can sometimes be embellished by creating hanging strips of material (aka fringe) along the edges for a fashionable bohemian look.	
2	Flared Trousers	Flared leg trousers are pants that get wider from the knee to the ankle, creating a bell-bottom shape. They have a snug fit around the hips and thighs, making them flow out at the bottom, giving a retro look.	
3	High-Neck Top	A high-necked flared sleeve shirt is a top with a neckline that covers the neck and typically flared or wide sleeves. This top can be created with and without the high neck feature depending on the student's preference.	
4	Frilly Top	A frilly-sleeved top is a blouse or shirt with sleeves that are adorned with ruffles, to create flowy elements. These sleeves often create a feminine and stylish look, adding a touch of elegance and flair to the top.	
5	Varsity Jacket	A classic, sporty outerwear piece typically made of wool and adorned with leather sleeves. It features a school or team emblem on the chest, ribbed cuffs, and a snap-button closure, embodying a timeless blend of athleticism and style.	
6	Waistcoat	A refined, sleeveless garment worn over a shirt and beneath a jacket. Typically crafted from fabric like wool or silk, it features a button-up front and a V-shaped neckline, adding a touch of formal elegance to attire.	

7	Tiered Skirt	A stylish garment characterized by layers of fabric that gradually descend from the waist to create a tiered or layered effect. This design adds movement and flair to the skirt, providing a playful and feminine aesthetic.	
8	Box pleated skirt	A skirt is a structured and tailored garment featuring pleats that are folded to create a box-like appearance. Typically starting at the waist, the pleats add volume and a neat, angular structure, offering a polished and sophisticated look to the skirt.	
9	Pinafore	A sleeveless, apron-style garment worn over a blouse, dress, or shirt. It features a bib front connected to a skirt, often with cross-back straps. Known for its simple and versatile design, the pinafore combines functionality with a charming, casual aesthetic.	
10	Cape	A sleeveless outer garment that drapes over the shoulders and fastens at the neck. It often extends to varying lengths, from short to full, providing both warmth and a dramatic, flowing silhouette. Capes come in various styles, materials, and can be a versatile accessory or a statement piece in fashion.	
11	Tiffany dress	a chic and festive garment, tailored for social events. Diverse in style, it ranges from casual to formal, often adorned with eye-catching details like sequins or lace, ensuring a fashionable statement for celebratory occasions.	
12	Quant dress	A Quant dress refers to a garment associated with Mary Quant, a pioneering fashion designer of the 1960s. Typically embodying mod fashion, it features bold patterns, short hemlines, and a youthful, avant-garde aesthetic.
